Rules and Regulations

The National Tenpin Bowling Championship for Persons with a Disability, (National Disability Championship) is a tenpin bowling tournament open to all Tenpin Bowling Australia (TBA) Registered Players who have a disability. The Championship is facilitated by the Australian Disabilities Tenpin Inc (ADTI) and attracts over 300 bowlers annually from all around Australia.

1. ELIGIBILITY

Definition of a Disability: TBA Rule 214 Disability – Definition Of: *A bowler with a disability is defined as any condition of the body or mind (impairment) that makes it more difficult for the person with the condition to do certain activities (activity limitation) and interact with the world around them (participation restrictions). The condition is permanent. It should be noted that degree or degrees of pain are not considered a disability.*

Any bowler who is unsure of their eligibility to compete should apply to the Tournament Director for final ruling. Bowlers may be asked to provide written medical information. It is the bowlers' responsibility to ensure evidence in support of their disability can be produced. Failure to produce acceptable evidence may result in disqualification with further participation in the tournament not permitted.

If requested, to prove a disability, a bowler will need to provide one of the types of evidence listed in:

Each bowler must be able to provide evidence of their disability at any time during the Tournament if requested.

Membership Requirements: All participants must be a registered member of Tenpin Bowling Australia for 2026:

Evidence of TBA 2026 Membership registration should be provided with the entry form. It is a TBA requirement for all TBA Accredited events that Tournament organisers request participants to present/provide a receipt or online confirmation via Tenpin Results showing payment. If TBA registration is not provided by the beginning of the championship, bowlers will be asked to pay the TBA sports registration fee before being allowed to bowl.

2026 TBA Registration Fee: \$85 adults/\$75 juniors

2. ENTERING AVERAGES

Bowlers must use their highest average in any league or accredited tournament over a minimum of 18 games as at **28 November, 2025**. *(Bowlers unable to provide an entering average as above and who competed in the 2025 Nationals can use the average achieved at the Nationals).*

Bowlers unable to meet the above must apply to the Tournament Director for Grading on a case-by-case basis before submitting an Entry.

If a bowler uses special equipment to aid in delivering the ball, averages must be established using that equipment. Confirmation of a bowler's average is required by the Tournament Director in the form of either individual bowler record sheets or league standing sheets at the average cut-off date. These are to be submitted with the Entry Form.

3. HOW TO ENTER

The National Disability Championship is open to bowlers of all levels and ages, however, no bumpers are allowed. Events include Singles, Doubles and Teams (4 bowlers). These are known as squads and each squad is a three-game series. Your grade will be based on your average. Refer to Page 11 to check your grade.

The entry fee for each squad is \$30 per bowler.

Bowlers may only enter a total of 15 squads.

Entry caps apply, please refer to Rule 6 Entry Dates/Capped Entries

The highest series in each Grade will win. In Singles, if a bowler holds more than one place in a Grade, they will only receive a Medal for the highest placed series.

Singles (*Refer entry cap - Rule 6).

Bowlers may have *unlimited entries in their Grade or any Grade above their own classification.

Doubles (2 bowlers) and Teams (4 bowlers) – Doubles and Teams can be mixed

Bowlers will be allowed *unlimited entries in Doubles and Teams (*Refer entry cap - Rule 6).

Each entry must be with a different partner and if you don't have a partner the Tournament Team will help you find one.

4. ALL EVENTS (OPTIONAL: ALL EVENTS FEE \$10)

An All Events Champion will be declared in every Grade. A bowler's **BEST** appearance in Teams, Doubles and Singles will count towards the All Events score. Entering average will determine the All Events classification.

The All Events Entry fee should be paid in conjunction with the bowler's entries and indicated on the Payment Summary attached to the Entry Form. Only one paid All Events entry fee of \$10 will be accepted from each entrant.

Note: To qualify for Master Events (refer page 7), bowlers must complete an All Events entry at these Championships. *The Open Masters and Classic Masters will be TBA Ranked Events. Ranking Points will be allocated to a combined Classic & Open All Events standings and a combined Classic & Open Masters Standings

5. VALID ENTRY

Entries with a minimum of 15% deposit of entry fee, will be processed in the order in which they are received by the Tournament Director and Treasurer. An entry will only be considered valid with the following:

- Entry Form + Payment Summary (or another form approved by the Tournament Director);
- TBA 2026 Membership Receipt, Bowler record or League standing sheet/s;
- Sports Integrity Declaration; and
- Entry fee deposit or full payment is received.

Entries not meeting these requirements will not be processed until all requirements are fulfilled.

6. ENTRY DATES / CAPPED ENTRIES

ADTI has in place a staged entry process and a cap on the number of squads a bowler may enter at each stage. This is to ensure that all bowlers have an opportunity to enter. Bowlers from the home state are encouraged to enter squads in the first week. This assists bowlers travelling from interstate.

Stage 1: (CLOSES 27 MARCH 2026 at 5pm AEST)

Stage 1: Entries are capped at nine (9) squads plus an All Events

A minimum of 15% deposit of the total Stage 1 entry fee is payable when submitting Stage 1 entries.

Full payment for all Stage 1 Entries is required by Friday, 1 May 2026 or those entries will be reallocated.

Stage 2: (ENTRIES OPEN 9am, 13 April and will close 8 May 2026 at 5pm AEST) *Subject to Squad Availability

Stage 2: Entries – subject to availability, bowlers may enter an additional three (3) squads

The total number of squads at the closure of Stage 2 is twelve (12) squads only.

(Stage 1, nine squads plus Stage 2, three squads)

Full payment for all Stage 2 Entries is required when submitting entries.

Entries will not be processed until payment is cleared.

Stage 3 Entry (During the National Championships)

Stage 3: Entries: Subject to availability, during the National Championships up to a total of 15 squads:

****If there are any squads available, Individual Bowlers or Groups may request additional squad entries for bowlers up to the combined maximum of 15 squads in total for the 2026 National Championships. A Register for additional squads during the Championships will be available. However, the Tournament Director may approve a bowler for additional squads over the 15 squad cap if required. Refer to the Tournament Room for details of squad availability. Pre-tournament credentials validating number of Squad entries should be provided to the Tournament Room with payment.**

Full payment is required when submitting entries and will not be processed until payment is cleared.

7. PRIZES (All Bowlers will receive a Participation Certificate.)

Medallions will be awarded to First, Second and Third place in each Grade and Event. There will be separate divisions for Men's & Women's Singles and All Events. In Singles, if a bowler holds more than one place in a Grade, they will only receive a Medal for the highest individual score. The individual with the next highest score will then receive the silver and the third highest score will receive bronze. This will be for both Men's and Women's Singles. In the event of a tie in any of the events, the tie will stand and all bowlers involved will be awarded a medal (*additional medals may need to be posted after the event*)

MEDAL PRESENTATIONS will follow the 'Caregivers Challenge' on Saturday, 13 June 2026.

Individual awards will be presented for Men's and Women's, High Series, Highest over Average and High Game.

8. LANE DRESSING/OILING

Lanes will be dressed prior to the start of the first squad, re-dressed after the 2nd squad and again before the 8pm squad each day. Please note if squads run late lane dress/oiling is at the discretion of the bowling centre. Refer to the daily schedule on Page 11. The Oil Pattern will be advised at a later date.

9. DRESS CODE (Includes the Master Events)

All bowlers are required to wear a collared shirt or bowling industry-manufactured shirt. Men may wear long pants or neat shorts. Ladies may wear slacks, shorts, skirts, 3/4 pants or skorts. Official Group or State Uniforms that include Track Pants will be accepted. No jeans, cargo pants, sweat pants, T shirts, tank tops, or hats are to be worn whilst competing unless an exemption to the dress rules has been sought from the Tournament Director.

Carers and support workers accompanying bowlers in the player area must also abide by the dress code and wear clean, closed footwear and wear the "Carer identification jacket" available from the Tournament Room. There should not be any other person in the players' area when bowlers are in play.

10. ELECTRONIC DEVICES (TBA Rule 215)

Unless issued an exemption by TBA, no electronic earpieces, headphones or any other electronic device, excluding hearing aids, can be worn or used by bowlers whilst they are competing in a session of games (refer Rule 128). Any application for exemption must be lodged with TBA at PO Box 77, Deception Bay, Qld, 4508 or emailed to tenpin.bowling@tenpin.org.au and must be accompanied by a medical certificate from a qualified medical practitioner. Carers/Support Workers accompanying a bowler in the players' area when a squad is in play must seek an exemption from the Tournament Director. This is the bowler's responsibility.

11. MOBILE PHONE

Bowlers, Carers/Support Workers **must switch their mobile phones off** whilst they are in play.

12. FOOD AND DRINK

Due to safety concerns with the possibility of spills which can cause trips and falls, there is to be no food or drink consumed within the player's area. **All food and drink must be kept and consumed behind the players' area.**

13. SPORTS INTEGRITY, COMPLAINTS AND PROCEDURES

ALL TBA RULES AND REGULATIONS WILL GOVERN THIS TOURNAMENT. ANY SITUATIONS NOT COVERED IN THESE RULES WILL BE REFERRED TO THE ADTI TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE.

In addition to the tournament rules the welfare, wellbeing and health of everyone involved in the National Disability Championships is a priority. Our bowlers, administrators, staff at the bowling centre, team officials, parents and support workers are all part of our bowling community.

➤ **DISPUTES & RESOLUTIONS (ADTI Constitution Clause 16)**

Disputes relating to the conduct of events will be referred to the Tournament Director to be handled with reference to the published Rules of the Event. Where necessary, reference will be made to the rules of the sport, and if disciplinary actions is required, the matter will be referred to TBA. All other matters will be referred to the Committee where at parties to the dispute will be afforded opportunities to submit their case of consideration. At all times natural justice will be afforded.

All disputes and other matters should be confirmed in writing.

➤ **RULE 124 PROTESTS - TIME LIMIT** **note reference to leagues has been omitted*

Protests involving eligibility, scoring or general playing rules in tournaments will be governed as follows:

TOURNAMENTS: Any protests affecting eligibility or general playing rules must be lodged with a responsible tournament official before the tournament prize payments are made. Such protest has to be confirmed in writing to a responsible tournament official, or TBA within 48 hours of the completion of the tournament.

PROTESTS – ERRORS IN SCORING

OBVIOUS ERRORS: Errors in scoring or errors in calculating tournament play must be corrected by a responsible tournament official immediately upon discovery of such error.

QUESTIONABLE ERRORS: The Management Committee of the tournament will decide upon questionable errors. Protests relating to questionable errors must be confirmed in writing to a responsible tournament official as follows:

Tournaments: Within 48 hours of the completion of the tournament.

Each protest under this rule must be specific in itself and this rule will not be construed to cover a previous or similar violation.

➤ **SPORTS INTEGRITY**

TBA has implemented Sports Integrity Australia's (SIA) National Integrity Framework which takes a proactive approach to mitigate integrity threats to sports and provide a safe, fair, and healthy environment for participants at all levels of the sport.

14. SPORTS INTEGRITY DECLARATION

All TBA members and participants have an obligation to protect and maintain the integrity of sport, as well as the health and wellbeing of our bowlers, administrators, team officials and the bowling centre staff.

All bowlers and team officials are required to complete the 2026 National Disability Championship Sports Integrity Declaration Form provided on the Entry Summary Sheet, (Page 9) or the Group Form (Page 18) and submit with the Entry Forms or lodge with the Tournament Office prior to the bowler's first squad.

Carers/Support Workers should also complete and submit to the Tournament Office prior to the bowler's squad. Managers responsible for Group/Teams may submit declarations together on a separate sheet.

COLE CUP CHALLENGE AND MICHAEL COOKE MEMORIAL SHIELD CHALLENGE

The State Challenge determines the best State/Territory representative team of tenpin bowlers, with the team consisting of eight (8) bowlers. The actual playing strength of any team will be five (5) bowlers

- *State/Territory Associations can enter one (1) team in each Challenge.*
- *State/Territory Associations can apply for up to two (2) draft bowlers, only if they have no more than five (5) available bowlers from their home state/territory. Refer to the Cole Cup Challenge and Michael Cooke Memorial Shield Rules-Regulations-Requirements for further information.*
- *Bowlers that compete in their respective State/Territory selection events and are not selected in the State/Territory team may register to be considered in the Cole Cup/Michael Cooke Memorial Shield Draft Bowler pool. The Draft Bowler Registration Form must be endorsed by the relevant State/Territory.*

13TH ANNUAL OPEN, CLASSIC & RESTRICTED MASTERS

Friday 12th and Saturday, 13th June 2026

Women's Divisions will be introduced in 2026 for a three year trial period

Open to TBA members who meet the definition of a bowler with a disability and who have completed an All Events entry at the 2026 National Tenpin Bowling Championships for Persons with a Disability, (2026 National Disability Championship).

ENTERING AVERAGE: The entering average for the Masters is the same as the entering average for the National Championship as at **28 November 2025 (Refer Rule 2)**

QUALIFYING: Qualifying will be the highest 3 game series in a Singles, Doubles OR Teams entry (plus handicap for the classic and restricted division) bowled during the Championship from Monday, 1 June 2026, until and including the 4:30pm squad on Thursday, 11 June 2026

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Any qualifying attempt will incur a **“Qualifying “Master’s Fee” of \$5.** The fee must be paid in cash when the bowler ‘checks in’ before the commencement of the squad.

Should a bowler wish to attempt to qualify in two (2) divisions, for example, Classic and Open, the Qualifying Masters Fee will apply to each division, therefore a total of \$10 payable on check in. Bowlers must clearly state the divisions on check in.

A bowler may attempt to qualify for more than one division, however, can only compete in one Masters Final. The Bowler must confirm in writing which Masters Final event they will compete in to the Tournament Team by 8am on Thursday, 10 June 2026.

OPEN MASTERS: This is a scratch event open to all bowlers. As an Open event no averages apply.

CLASSIC MASTERS: This is a handicapped event based on 100% of 200, open to bowlers whose entering averages for the championships at 28 November 2025 is

Mens: 120 and 159

Womens: 110 and 149

***The Open Masters and Classic Masters will also be TBA Ranked Events. Ranking points will be allocated to a combined Classic & Open All Event standings and a combined Classic & Open Masters Standings. TBA is responsible for all Ranked Events and any enquiries should be directed to TBA.*

RESTRICTED MASTERS: This is a handicapped event based on 100% of 200, open to bowlers whose entering averages for the championships at 28 November 2025 is

Mens: 119 and below

Womens: 109 and below

The Masters Qualifying list will be updated after each day and displayed within the centre by the following morning, excluding Thursday, 11 June 2026 in which it will be displayed at approximately midday.

Final standing will be emailed and posted on Facebook by 8pm. Please note they will NOT be posted on Tenpin Results.

It is the Bowler’s responsibility to check the Final Standings for the Masters to see if they have qualified for the Finals.

13TH ANNUAL OPEN, CLASSIC & RESTRICTED MASTERS

FINALS

FINALS FORMAT:

The Masters Finals will have no more than sixteen (16) bowlers, Women's and Men's, in each master event. The 16 positions include the automatic entry** of the:

- 2025 ADTI National Championship Masters Champion (*an all events must be completed*)
- State/Territory Masters Winners (*an all events must be completed*)

***The automatic 2025 ADTI National Championship Masters winners, and the State/Territory Master Representatives average as at 28 November 2025 must be:*

*120 to 159 Men and 110-149 Women in the Classic Division and
119 and below Men and 109 and below Women in the Restricted Division.*

***If the automatic 2025 ADTI National Championship Masters winners, and the State/Territory Master Representatives average is above the average restrictions for that Masters event they are not entitled to automatic qualification for the Restricted, Classic or Open masters.*

Notification of State/Territory winners must be lodged by Friday, 1 May 2026.

Vacancies for the remainder of the 16 bowler positions for the Masters Finals will be filled by qualifiers, with two (2) reserves for each Masters event.

In the event of a tie for 16th position, a 9th/10th frame roll off will take place.

MASTERS CHECK IN

Bowlers are required to "check in" prior to the commencement of the Masters Finals.

The Masters Final Entry Fee of \$100 (in cash) is payable on check in.

Classic and Restricted Divisions: Friday, 12 June 2026

CLASSIC: 7:30am (Check in Opens) 7:55am (Check in Closes) Bowling commencing at 8:15am

At 7:55am any absent bowlers' names will be called three (3) times.

If not in centre after 3rd call reserves will be called in order

RESTRICTED: 11:30am (Check in Opens) 11:55am (Check in Closes) Bowling commencing at 12:15pm.

At 11:55am any absent bowlers' names will be called three (3) times.

If not in centre after 3rd call reserves will be called in order

Open Division: Saturday, 13 June 2026

OPEN: 8am (Check in Opens) 8:20am (Check in Closes)) Bowling commencing at 8:30am

At 8:20am any absent bowlers' names will be called three (3) times.

If not in centre after 3rd call reserves will be called in order.

MASTERS FINALS

The Masters Final will be 8 Games (4x2 game blocks). Bowlers in each division will be ranked according to total pinfall after the 8 games bowled (including handicap in the Classic and Restricted Division).

The top 3 in each division will bowl in a one game step ladder final. 3rd position plays 2nd position in match one, with the winner to play the top seed in the final match. Should the top seed lose the first match, a further one game match will determine the winner. Should a tie take place, a 9th and 10th frame playoff will be used to break the tie.

The winners in each division, (Mens and Womens) will be declared the 2026 ADTI National Masters Champion and will be awarded a cash prize (dependant on number of qualifying attempts), trophy and entry into the 2027 National Disability Championship Masters. 2nd and 3rd place will receive a cash prize. Cash prizes will be based on 50% for 1st, 30% for 2nd and 20% for 3rd based on the prize fund for **each division**.
